Wow!!! I cannot believe that we are almost halfway through the school year. It has been a great semester, and I'm so proud of how far the students have come in such a short amount of time. I continue to be amazed with the students' levels of talent and the individual work that they have put into their playing their instruments. Many arrive before and

In November, 14 students traveled to Kansas City to audition for the Northeast Kansas Honor Band. The audition process is extremely difficult, and the students have to practice many individual hours of to perform the music. In addition to the NE Kansas Honor Band, we recently learned that 17 students who were nominated for the Kansas State Honor band have been selected to perform at KSU in late January. This is also a tremendous honor, and I cannot wait to see how much the students grow from these experiences.

After wrapping a successful marching season, the band has transitioned to pep and concert band. We have a significant number of public performances before the break, and details for the performances will continue to be sent via Remind 101. I want to make sure to thank Band Booster president Becky Florance, our Band Booster board members, and parent volunteers for all your help this year. I don't think you realize how much you mean to our program, and the success that we have would not be possible without you. We have so many talented parents who donate their time and skills to the band, and you are some of the most unselfish individuals I have ever met.
