## DRIVER EDUCATION RECOMMENDATIONS FROM Mr. Erickson

- If your student is 14 and motivated to drive, pick up a Kansas driving handbook from me and have them get their learner's permit asap (the handbook is online as well, http://www.ksrevenue.org/pdf/dlhb.pdf). They do need to study the handbook, as there are tricky questions.
- 2. If you are going to let your students "practice" before driver's education, have them get their learner's permit (see #1). I do not advise letting your students practice without a license, even on dirt roads (safety, illegal, insurance, etc.)!!
- 3. Driving a car is serious business!! You have to be **responsible** to drive. You also have to be **responsible** to pass drivers education. Passing the classroom portion of driver's education is not easy, but it is easier with a commitment from the student to learn about the best and safest way to drive a car. Students need to commit that they will set "other" things aside as needed to progress through the online class. Driver's Education is just the 1<sup>st</sup> step in many additional hours of safe practice that is needed for the student.
- 4. If your student does not understand the expense of driver's education, and the value of learning to drive safe, then they may not be ready to drive a car.
