We are fortunate as a district to get a SPOT vision screener. These screens are much more accurate and take approximately 3 seconds to capture results. This screening device is especially helpful in our young students and those with disabilities.

### Baseball and the Overbrook Ballfields

In April of 2019, the SFTHS Head Baseball Coach, Jim Duncan contacted the city of Overbrook about the possibility of the school taking over the maintenance of the north diamond. This is the diamond that SFTHS play varsity and junior varsity home baseball games. In May, Patrick Graham and Keith Johnson met with members of Overbrook Parks and Recreation (OPR) about the possibility of SFTHS taking over the field maintenance during the high school playing season doing prep work each fall. This would entail prepping the field for games and keeping it in playing shape from the fall to the end of the high school playing season. Over the past few years, OPR hasn't made this field a priority for the high school season. OPR has made a commitment to change the infield playing surface to all

screenings in lieu of the grass infield and red dirt, plus put in some drainage tile. We feel this will allow the high school teams to play on those days where pooling water has stifled us from playing in the past.

During the off-season, SFTHS plans to do the spraying, fertilizing, and seeding to enhance the field. The costs for the product will be split 50/50 between SFTHS and OPR. OPR will continue to be responsible for the mowing and purchase of the lime dust to line the field.

The total cost for fertilizer, seed, and spray for the fall and spring would be approximately \$800. This cost would be split 50/50 with OPR, making our costs about \$400 from fall 2019 through the end of spring 2020.
