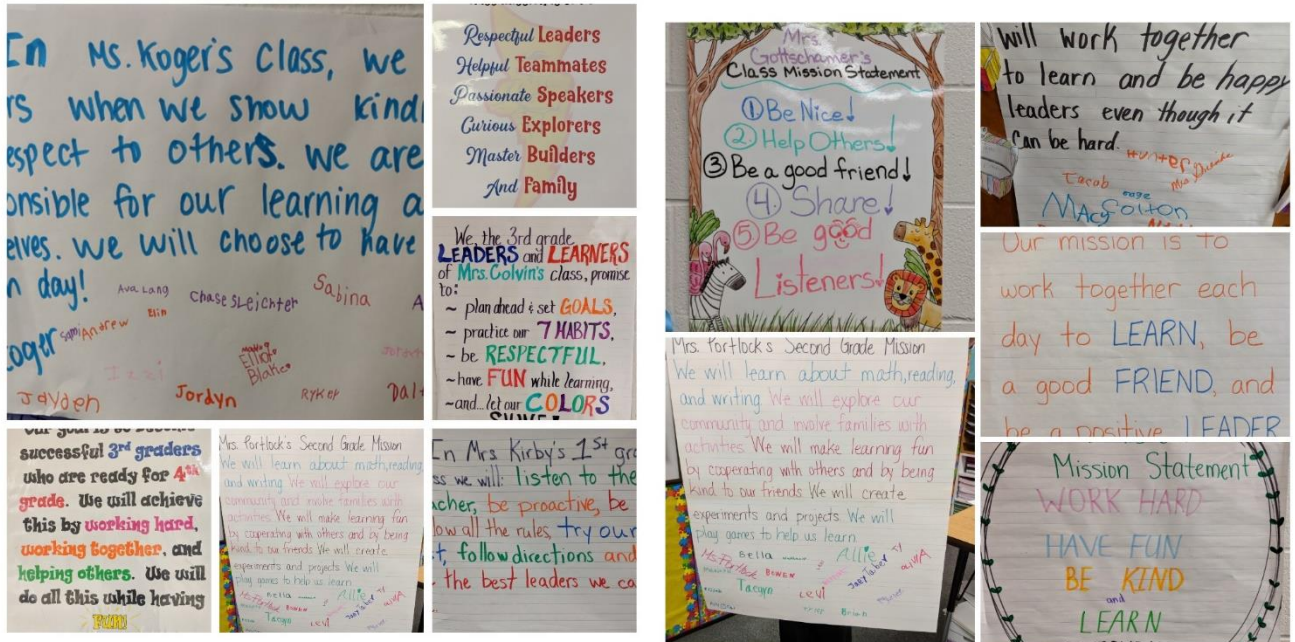


**Overbrook Attendance Center

*Any time I see a doctor, it is best practice to return with a note with proof of doctor visit and any restrictions that may be a result of that visit.
