January Highlights:

Facilities: New Year, New Changes at CAC! The new carpet in the 6th Grade / Junior High corridor looks fabulous. Faculty & Staff:

Jan. 6 Teacher Prep Day: Building administration facilitated a 90 minute staff meeting focusing on the following goals: establishing peer consultant pairings; CAC goals areas of Teaching & Learning; Behavior & Discipline, and School Culture. Action plans followed later in the month folded into our school redesign plans. In addition, 15 minute one-on-one listening sessions were held with each member of our certified staff.

Jan. 20 Professional Development: Data & Redesign: Superintendent Denk presented a five year snapshot of data relevant to academics and behavior for the district. This information was used to help inform and guide our discussion throughout the day. The CAC staff established the following Investigation Teams to work on school Redesign: Academic, School Culture, and Student Life.

Personnel: Tom Fenton, 8th Grade Science, will be retiring this spring. The vacancy was posted in late December and interviews are scheduled Feb. 5, we are encouraged by the interest and quality candidates applying for this position. There are no other known vacancies at this time.

Safety (ESI): On Thursday and Friday, Jan 30-31, we met with invited guests from the Kansas State Dept. of Education (KSDE) Kansas Technical Assistance System Network (TASM) who are providing us with technical assistance relating to specific practices embedded in our Special Education Program. Part of their assistance and support will include ongoing visits to all areas of our school to collect data, make observations, and participate in meetings with Three-Lakes Coop administrators and support staff, our own district administration and support staff, and teaching staff during the next few weeks. We are working together in a proactive, collaborative effort to identify areas where we can improve outcomes for our students using data driven decision making.

Bullying behavior continues to be a disciplinary focus, both in response to referrals and in a proactive way. Statistically, one out of every five students will be bullied this year. Administration has been addressing concerns reported by students, parents, and staff on a case by case basis using the materials we distributed at the December 14 faculty meeting. This process includes inviting students to sign a pledge committing to: Support others who have been hurt or harmed; Treat others with kindness; be more accepting of people's differences. Approximately 10 percent of our students have been involved in intervention meetings with parents and administration in December and January and signed pledges.

Communication: A daily faculty and staff bulletin has been created to address many of the "need to know" issues that arise each day/week. The faculty meeting schedule allows only limited time to meet and discuss needs with certified staff. The daily bulletin has been well received and is greatly appreciated by many of our support staff who previously felt "out of the loop" regarding many building wide activities impacting students and staff.

January Joint PTO: CAC hosted the January meeting and included a guest speaker who as a parent, volunteered to come and speak to share a parent perspective on the impact of bullying. The topic was well received and appreciated by the group. Plans were discussed for spring events and fundraising. PTO also provided a wonderful gift to all staff at the end of the month, an insulated mug with SFT lettering. Thank you to our PTO!

January Bolt Buddies: Classroom activities were planned in January. In December, Bolt Buddies got together to build Gingerbread Houses.
