### Football

Currently, the varsity Chargers are 2-3 on the season. Homecoming was a success with the 55-42 victory over Bishop Ward. Three of the four King candidates scored touchdowns (the fourth candidate just had surgery, otherwise it likely would have been all 4). The Chargers have Topeka-Hayden, Osawatomie, Bishop Ward, Baldwin, and Perry-Lecompton in their district this year. The top 4 teams in districts will advance to the playoffs. Varsity is 2-0 in district play, with Hayden, Baldwin, and Perry-Lecompton left. The junior varsity is 3-2 on the season while the freshmen have competed well, and are 3-1. Each squad has 3 games left.

### <u>Volleyball</u>

As of October 7<sup>th</sup>, the Santa Fe Trail Charger varsity volleyball team is 5-1 in league, and 10-13 overall. The varsity team will travel to Council Grove this weekend for their final regular season tournament. The JV travel to Perry-Lecompton for their final tournament. On Saturday, October 21<sup>st</sup>, the Chargers will travel to Burlington for Sub-State action. The other teams involved in that Sub-State will be Burlington, Eureka, Fredonia, Anderson County, Neodesha, Osage City, and West Franklin. State volleyball will be played in Hutchinson, October 31<sup>th</sup>.

### Girls Golf

The girls' golf team continues to improve on their individual scores and places as the season rolls on. Santa Fe Trail hosted our tournament on September 15<sup>th</sup> at Lamont Hill Golf Course.
