Athletics and Activities at Santa Fe Trail High School

Athletic teams began practice on August 13th after a very dry and hot summer. Santa Fe Trail is proud to encourage all of our students involved in activities in their quest to represent our school and community in a positive way. Football

The 2018 Charger Football Team consists of 55 players this year. SFT is able to support a schedule consisting of freshmen/C, junior varsity, and varsity teams. The annual Blue/White scrimmage was held on August 24th allowing the coaching staff to see the team in a setting other than the practice field. The varsity hosted Prairie View on Friday, August 31st and lost a close one to the Buffaloes 20-19. The JV traveled to Prairie View on Tuesday, September 4th and came away with a 30-28 victory in 2 OT's. Today, the freshmen travel to

Prairie View to open their season. The varsity team will travel to Osawatomie on Friday, September 7th.

<u>Volleyball</u>

Santa Fe Trail started the season with a varsity tournament on Saturday, September 1st at Jefferson West and went 0-5 on the day. The junior varsity and varsity traveled to Burlington on September 4th to play Louisburg and Kansas City-Piper. The Junior Varsity lost both, and Varsity split, beating KC-Piper and losing to Louisburg. There are 19 volleyball players on the roster for 2018.
