UPDATE ON THE CHARGER DAYS

We now move our focus to the November 14th Charger Day. This day will feature our students going to our three communities in the afternoon working outdoors cleaning up leaves and many more projects. We will also have our students who plan to enroll in Allen County College (ACC) courses in 2019-20, take the Accuplacer Test. This placement test will determine if they will be able to enroll in their classes. We have a record number of students participating due to the change of policy by ACC. It used to be just sophomores testing but there are quite a few juniors this year too.

With most of our Charger Days, our students will continue to work on their Project Based Learning (PBL). This will be the same on November. We just moved the time to morning to let it warm up outside in the afternoon. All in all, we look forward to another Charger Day for SFTHS.

KSHSAA Buffer Week

The KSHSAA Senior High Fall Athletic Buffer Week is Monday, November 5th thru Sunday, November 11th. There shall be no athletic practice, offseason conditioning, informal basketball shooting, working out on wrestling mats, etc. in **school owned** facilities during the fall athletic buffer week. Athletic activities of this nature may not be held under the supervision of a school staff member in non-school facilities. This means a **moratorium** on all school sponsored athletic activities during this week. Gymnasiums shall not be open to students during the fall athletic buffer week for purposes of shooting baskets, working out with weights, etc. **outside of school hours**. Noon hour and physical education classes are considered part of the school day. Buffer week does not eliminate football practices for those senior high schools who qualify for football playoffs until such time their footballs season is over.
