Dual Sport Participation

There has been some interest from students who would like to participate in 2 sports during the spring season. Below is the Board policy on this issue:

Students may participate in two sports during one season, with approval from the coaches of both sports. In addition, a parent meeting with the coaches and athlete will occur prior to the season beginning. Next, two sport athletes are expected to begin their dual sports on the same day. If they do not, the days missed will be considered to be unexcused. After two unexcused absences from one sport, they will no longer be able to participate in both sports.

Forensics

The Forensics Squad got off to a great start to the 2017 season with a 2nd place team finish at the McClouth Invitational on Saturday, January 27th. There were 4 state qualifiers on this day also. There next competition will be Saturday, February 17th at Lyndon.

Concussion Program

Santa Fe Trail High School students who are planning to participate in sports/cheer/dance anytime during the 2017-2018 school year are required to attend a free Concussion In Sports on-line course prior to starting practices. Those students who are participating in spring sports will be required to have this process completed prior to the start of practice on Monday, February 26th. Those that have not completed this requirement by that time, will not be allowed to practice until they have it completed. This is a requirement by the Kansas State High School Activities Association Executive Board. Anyone can participate in these courses and many others offered by NFHS by going to NFHSLearn.com. Once completed,

you can either print off your certificate or take a photo of it for proof of completion. Again, this is a requirement for any student who plans to participate in sports/cheer/dance during the 2017-2018 school year.
