The Lady Chargers begin the regular season with a home match on Thursday, August 31 vs Osage City. The Varsity went 1-1 and JV went 2-0 on the night. That was followed up with a Saturday tournament at Jeff West. The team came away with a 4th place finish at the Jeff West Tournament. Next home action for the volleyball team will be on Tuesday, September 12 when SFT hosts Pioneer League opponents Osawatomie, Anderson Co, and Wellsville. Game time is 4:30. The team consists of 21 players and will play both Varsity and JV this season.

Girls Golf

Charger Lady Golf is off to a great start. They have competed in two 9-hole varsity tournaments so far. We have had ladies medal in each of these tournaments. The first tournament was held at Village Greens which consisted of 44 players. Braegan Buessing shot 44 which was good for 3rd place and Bailey Anshutz carded a 45 which finished 6th. The second tournament was hosted by Ottawa at the Ottawa Golf Course. This tournament had 53 competitors and Bailey Anshutz placed third with a score of 39 and Braegan Buessing placed 6th shooting 42. The Lady Charger Golf team is made up of 11 girls and will compete in both Varsity and JV meets this season.

Cross Country

Great start to the Cross Country season! The team consists of 12 boys and 8 girls for this year. The second meet of the season will be held on Thursday, September 7 at Holton with a start of 4:00.
