A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear Charger Families,

This year you will be hearing a lot about our new Open Court reading curriculum that supports the Science of Reading in the classroom. The Science of Reading refers to research that has been conducted over the past twenty years by reading experts and cognitive scientists. This research has shown us some of the best methods for teaching students to read.



Below are some terms you may encounter in your child's reading instruction this year.

- **Phoneme** the smallest until of sound represented by a letter or letters. There are 44 phonemes in the English language.
- Grapheme the letter or letters that represent a phoneme
- **Phonemic awareness** the ability to identify, hear and manipulate sounds in the spoken language.
- Word Mapping the process of breaking a word down into its phonemes and writing the graphemes that represent phonemes. This processed is used in the classroom to practice their spelling words.

Throughout the year I will be sharing some of the instructional strategies that are teachers are using to help our students with explicit phonics instruction.



Sound-by-Sound Blending

When first doing Sound-by-Sound Blending, ask for the sound as you point to each spelling. Once students are comfortable with the routine, drop the verbal cues, point to the spellings, and have students give the sounds.

- · Write or display the spelling for the first sound.
- Have students say the sound.
- · Write the spelling for the second sound.
- · Have students say the sound.
- If the second sound is a vowel, blend through the vowel by making a blending motion with your hand.
- · Write the spelling of the next sound.
- Have students say the sound.
- If it is the last sound in the word, make the blending motion as students blend and read the word. If it is not the last sound, continue writing the spellings and asking students for each remaining sound.
- · Have students reread the word naturally as they would say it.
- · Complete a line, and have students reread the words in the line naturally.
- · Continue through each word in the remaining lines until all words have been blended.
- · Have students use selected words in sentences and extend the sentences.
- Review the blended words using the Developing Oral Language activities.

COUNSELORS CORNER

What we are learning?

In our classes we are finishing up learning about our emotions and some strategies to regulate them. It is important to be able to regulate your own emotions and that is one of our goals at this level.

We are moving into our lessons about bullying. This is required among all schools. Our kids will focus on what bullving is and how they can handle conflict. We talk about Stop. Walk and

Talk. Being able to tell someone to stop being unkind, walk away from them and tell or talk to an adult. We will practice this in class as well.

October/November also brings about Red Ribbon Week. At this age, sometimes it is hard for kids to completely understand what Red Ribbon Week means and why we talk about it. They will get lessons on safe choices, staying away from drugs, etc. but also we will focus on making healthy choices.

We will have a spirit week from October 23rd - October 27th that will focus on a healthy choice each day with some fun theme days to go with it. As always, let me know if you have any questions or if I can help you or your child!


