By analyzing the results we can assist team members with implementation of identified next steps to continue to facilitate student learning. This process allows us to:

Below are ways the teachers are addressing student achievement with their action steps. Staff has been using the morning collaboration time to review their assessment data to guide their

instruction. Additionally, they are posting and addressing content objectives with students as outlined in the walkthrough data below from the beginning of September to the end of December. Furthermore teachers are utilizing the new content materials in both reading and math to provide quality instruction with 84% accuracy. Please note there are times when walkthroughs are completed and staff might be completing a fun activity, craft, etc that always is an important part of elementary education.


