Practice Evacuation Drill

Students will take part in a practice evacuation drill on Wednesday, May 8th in the morning. We will walk to the public library and practice going to our designated areas.

OAC's Evacuation Procedures: An orderly and preplanned exit from a building when conditions are safer outside than inside.

- Make a clear speech intercom announcement.
- Call 911, if warranted
- Notify Central Office
- Take closest & safest planned route out of building.

- Teachers take attendance – take classroom kit (if available).
 - Office staff ensures evacuation destination is safe.
 - Office staff take building crisis kit & megaphone.
 - Office staff account for itinerant staff & visitors.
 - Assist those with special needs

MARCHING IN MAY

Art- It is so hard to believe we are coming up on summer already! Third grade has been working so hard on their Art show projects! The other grades are working on on team building. We have a few group projects coming up!

Explore- Kindergarten will focus on problem-solving and be introduced to “coding” while first grade will expand on their problem-solving skills and try to fix “bugs” within their codes. School Safety and Security

BOE Goal: 6.2

Use Effective crisis plans to provide proactive readiness in case of an emergency

In 2019, the State of Kansas/state fire marshal modified the number of Fire, Tornado, and Crisis drills that schools will need to have throughout the school year (at least four fire drills, two tornado drills (one in September and one in March) and three crisis drills). Students and staff train and practice periodically throughout the school year on various Crisis protocols.

Additionally, USD 434 admin worked together to develop similar crisis protocols for staff in each building utilizing the same language. These hang in each classroom by the door.
