A message from our principal

Dear Charger Families,

This year we are focusing on reducing our chronic absenteeism. OAC will reduce the chronic absenteeism of 8.63% rate by 2% for students. Chronic absenteeism is defined as missing ten percent or more of the academic year for any reason, including excused absences, unexcused absences, and suspensions. Based on a 165day school year, that means approximately 16.5 days per year or 2 days per month.

When students attend school on a regular basis, they are more likely to succeed in their academics and graduate from high school. The responsibility of school attendance for the elementary school falls on the shoulders of the parents or guardians. When a student



is absent, it is the responsibility of the parents/guardians to call the elementary office at 1-800-826-9525 ext 2 before or on the day of the absence.

POSSIBLE STRATEGIES TO REACH MY CHILD'S ATTENDANCE GOALS:

- I will talk to my child about how going to school every day will help my child do well in school and achieve my child's hopes and dreams.
- I will keep an attendance chart at home to track absences. Consider using the attached calendar.
- At the end of the week, I will recognize my child for attending school every day with ____i.e. a visit to the park, a new book, a break from doing chores, a special treat, etc.).
- I will make sure my child is in bed by ____p.m. and the alarm clock is set for ____a.m.
- I will find a relative, friend or neighbor who can take my child to or from school if I can not.
- I will set up medical and dental appointments for weekdays after school.
- If my child has a slight stomachache, headache or allergies, and doesn't have a contagious illness including Covid-19, I will send my child to school. I will call the school or a health provider for advice if my child complains regularly.
- If my child cannot avoid missing school, I will contact the teacher for tips and resources to keep my child learning.

If your child is struggling to come to school consider setting some goals from the list above. To help improve my child's attendance, I commit to the following:

What we are learning?

In our classes we are finishing up learning about our emotions and some strategies to regulate them. It is important to be able to regulate your own emotions and that is one of our goals at this level.

We are moving into our lessons about bullying. This is required among all schools. Our kids will focus on what bullying is and how they can handle conflict. We talk about Stop, Walk and Talk. Being able to tell someone to stop being unkind, walk away from them and tell or talk to an adult. We will practice this in class as well.

October/November also brings about Red Ribbon Week. At this age, sometimes it is hard for kids to completely understand what Red Ribbon Week means and why we talk about it. They will get lessons on safe choices, staying away from drugs, etc. but also we will focus on making healthy choices.

We will have a spirit week from October 15th-17th that will focus on a healthy choice each day with some fun theme days to go with it. As always, let me know if you have any questions or if I can help you or your child!

A Note from the Nurse



Many of you might know that we have two students in our district that are battling Aplastic Anemia & both urgently need a bone marrow transplant. These girls share a deep bond & hope for a brighter future. The family is working closely with The NMDP Registry to help find a marrow match for BOTH of these girls. At Homecoming's Shop the Trail last Friday, the SFT Nursing Department teamed up with the family and other staff to host a Blood Stem Cell Donor Registry event along with their fundraising efforts. At the end of the night, 45 members of our community signed up to get their name on the National Registry List in hopes to find a match, if not for these girls, then for someone else.

It's no more than a cheek swab and answering some questions to get registered - 5 minutes tops. Anyone in the age range of 18-40 can join the registry AT NO COST.

If you are not yet 18 but would like to join, PLEASE REACH OUT TO ME!! I can help you fill out the paperwork and get you on the waiting list. A swab kit will be mailed to you on your 18th birthday.
