

elephant toothpaste. Different groups of students used different components in the experiment to see how those components affected the reaction. They also discovered what component acted as the catalyst in the experiment.










**ACC Spanish**




#### **Activities Update**

She won the top spot after a three hole scorecard playoff!




#### **Boys Basketball**
