


Charger Families,

Most common symptoms being seen are (but not limited to)

- -Chills
- -Fatigue & weakness
- -Cough
- -Wheezing
- -Runny or Stuffy Nose -Headache
- -Chest Discomfort &/or Congestion
- -Decreased appetite
- -Muscle/Body Aches
- -Sore Throat
- -Sneezing
- -Nausea/Vomiting
- -Diarrhea



The full policy is posted on the school website, but a few quick reminders: Students and staff can return to school with:

- -Overall Symptom improvement
- -Fever free without use of fever reducing medications for 24hours
- -Symptom free after a positive COVID/Flu test -Vomit/Diarrhea free for 24 hours without use of medications
- -Able to conduct daily routine in the classroom

- K/1 students will travel to Brookside during their music class time to perform for the residents on 12/6.




