Culinary Arts

The SFT Food Service program asked the Culinary Arts students to make (2000) cookies to be given to all students and staff every day the last five days of the semester. This was quite an undertaking and experience for the students. First the students had to convert recipes to yield 400 servings. The SFT Culinary room is designed for home baking but the students transformed their basic equipment, borrowed a couple large bowls, and utilized other large general storage

containers for creative measuring and mixing of these industrial quantities. They also had to whip and mix with no mechanically powered equipment. This was a project by the Advanced Culinary classes, however as limited class time restricted completion, the Culinary I students also got in on the mixing action. The students shaped the cookies to a uniform size and were conscious of sanitation and quality control throughout the entire production process. They had the honor of passing out the cookies during lunch to everyone. They received many compliments on their work.

questions in small groups about the Vietnam Era of history as well as life lessons learned. Thank you so much to Bob Hug and Brookside retirement community helping to bring community generations together.











Scholars Bowl

SFTHS regular season Scholars Bowl ended on December 19th. Our varsity squad will compete in the League Tournament at Anderson County on January 15th.

Our team had over 37 students in grades 9-12 attending practices, with a final number of 24 "official" squad members competing. One thing our Charger community really prides itself in is encouraging our students to participate in a variety of extracurricular activities, so sponsor Mrs. Michaelis tries to schedule the participant rosters around sports competitions, clubs and fine arts events. That may mean some students are only able to attend our team practices, or only compete in one or two meets, but we welcome all students to participate at their ability and availability.

Scholars Bowl truly is a great unifier for students from all walks of life and interests. It's not just for students that get straight As, or college bound kids; but has questions over Career and Technical Education; movies and music; current events and pop culture, in addition to core school subjects.

Scholars Bowl competition at the high school level was sanctioned by KSHSAA in 1986, and now has approximately 333 member schools participating. This activity features head to head academic team competition with quick response answers and a time limit on questions. It's not enough to simply KNOW the answer, you have to beat the other team and be the first to buzz in with the correct answer.



Wrestling

The wrestling team is getting ready to enter their 3rd week of competition before heading into Winter Break.

The boys varsity took 8th at the Spring Hill Duals out of 12 teams; and then went on a road trip west. They dualed Holcomb and Oakley High School - beating both schools; and then competed in the Colby Eagle Dual Invitational taking 5th place out of 18 teams, going 7-2 on the weekend in total. 

Testing Opportunities for Students

ASVAB Test

Students will have the opportunity to take the ASVAB test on Thursday, January 23rd at 10 AM. This test is open to all students grades 9-12 who are interested in learning more about their skills and strengths in future occupations.


The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) is a multiple-aptitude battery that measures developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success in the military. Students can sign up for this free test by emailing Mrs. Chiddix no later than January 14th. For students considering a career in the military, their scores are good for 2 years prior to enlistment.

Kansas ACT

The Kansas ACT assessment for juniors will be administered on Tuesday, February 25th. This is the free test available to juniors who are planning to attend a post-secondary institution upon graduation.

To assist students in preparing for the ACT test, we have arranged for Carolyn DeVane from PowerPrep Inc. to come and work with all Juniors planning to take the ACT on February 6th. The prep includes not only strategies, but also practice testing. The cost of this course is being covered by our district.
