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BOE Goal 5: Budget/Facilities

In collaboration with our custodial team and the district office, we have identified several facility and equipment needs to be considered for capital outlay funding. The following list represents prioritized items essential to maintaining and improving the learning environment and operational functionality of our building:

Facility and Infrastructure Needs:

- Painting in Rooms 137 and 147, gym wall, and application of concrete paint to bathroom floors
- Replacement of carpet in Rooms 140, 141, 147, and 149
- Repair of the existing electrical box
- Replacement of five (5) skylights
- Replacement of Windows

Playground and Outdoor Improvements:

- Installation of playground edging for safety and maintenance
- Grading of existing pea gravel to improve surface conditions

Furniture and Equipment:

- Acquisition of lunchroom tables (in coordination with district resources)
- Installation of a sound system in the music room to support instructional and performance needs

BOE Goal 6: School Safety and Security

We will continue to review and update our crisis response plans, with the addition of a cardiac arrest response protocol for the 2025–2026 school year. These plans will be reviewed with staff at

the beginning of the school year, and scheduled drills will be conducted throughout the year to ensure preparedness and compliance.
