
Interventions Update Kaytee Deines Welcome back, Chargers! My name is Mrs. Deines and I am the 4th-8th grade math and reading interventionist. I, along with my team of academic coaches, support our teachers in strengthening all students' math and reading skills. 4th and 5th grade students receive specialized lessons in math and reading both in and out of the classroom twice a day. 6th-8th grade students are focusing on literacy skills this year with a new class called lit lab. All students in grades 6-8 have been sorted based on FastBridge data and diagnostic screeners into four groups to receive specialized literacy lessons. These lessons range from fluency, comprehension, phonics, and novel studies. This is a slight change from last year where only some students were able to receive these lessons, and allows students to not be pulled from an elective. In the upcoming weeks we will be taking our Fall FastBridge assessments and regroup all students based on skill needs. If you have any questions please feel free to contact

PE & WEIGHTS


