




National Honor Society

- 3. Parents, grandparents, loved ones can purchase a senior tribute in the book. We have three simple price points and sizes. The Santa Fe Trail Chargers (3A, 8-0) closed out a remarkable undefeated regular season with a dominant 54-13 win over Bishop Ward on Friday, October 24th. The Chargers captured both the District Championship and Pioneer League title, establishing themselves as one of the most complete and consistent teams in Class 3A this year. Behind an explosive offense and a physical defense, the Chargers have outscored opponents 340-87 on the year and continue to roll with confidence heading into the postseason.



On Halloween night, the Chargers defeated Perry Lecompton at home for first round of playoffs 20-14 to advance to the Regional Playoffs to be hosted on Friday, November 7.




