母 Title Night & SITE Council Recap

Did you miss Title Night or our SITE Council update? No worries — here's a quick recap!

At **Title Night**, families enjoyed a variety of **fun math games** designed to help students practice key skills while spending quality time together. If you were able to join us, we hope you had a great time!

During our **SITE Council meeting**, we shared information about **FastBridge assessments** and our school's **Wildly Important Goals (WIGs)**. Below is a quick overview of what these mean for your child's learning.

Understanding Key Assessments and Goals for Your Child What is a WIG?

A WIG stands for Wildly Important Goal. It's a clear, focused goal that helps guide student growth in key academic areas such as reading or math. WIGs help students and teachers track progress and celebrate growth throughout the year.



FastBridge is an assessment tool used to measure skills in reading, math, and other areas for students in **Kindergarten through 3rd grade**. It's given several times a year and helps teachers identify what your child already knows and where they may need additional support.

Why do students take FastBridge?

- To measure academic growth over time
- To identify strengths and areas needing support
- To help teachers plan instruction and interventions so every child can succeed

What is CBM Fluency?

CBM stands for *Curriculum-Based Measurement*. Fluency assessments measure how quickly and accurately a student can read words or solve math facts. These results help teachers determine if students are reading or performing math at grade level and where extra practice may be needed. K–1 Fluency Assessments

- LNF (Letter Naming Fluency): How quickly students can name letters
- LSF (Letter Sound Fluency): How quickly students can say letter sounds
- NWF (Nonsense Word Fluency): How well students can sound out and read made-up words, showing decoding ability

Sight Word Fluency

This assessment measures how quickly and accurately students recognize and read common high-frequency words (like *the*, *said*, *come*, *was*). Knowing these words automatically helps students read more smoothly and with better comprehension.
