Dear Charger Families,


Throughout the month of December, students will begin their Winter FastBridge assessments. Staff will use this data to support academic growth and guide grade-level data meetings. By reviewing the results, we can collaborate as a team to identify next steps that will continue to strengthen student learning.

This process allows us to:

- Support academic growth
- Strengthen our ability to use data to guide instruction
- Identify students who may benefit from additional services



In addition, we will also be reviewing our **Wildly Important Goal (WIG)** with students. Our school-wide goal is for **90% of our K–3 students to show growth in reading fluency and/or maintain benchmark or above**. Each time a student shows growth, they will get to add a sticker to our WIG wall so we can celebrate and visually track our progress together.



Counselor's Corner

This month in our counseling lessons, we are learning all about **friendship and handling conflict in positive ways**. Students are practicing how to be good friends, how to use kind words, and how to solve small problems peacefully. We are also learning simple strategies—like taking turns talking, using "I" statements, and asking for help when needed—to help them build healthy relationships at school and at home.

CONDITION FOR	CONDITIONS FOR
EXCLUSION	RETURNING
FROM SCHOOL	TO SCHOOL
Oral Temperature- of 100.4 or with nursing discretion based on symptoms.	Return to school when fever free for 24 hours without use of medication.
Positive COVID/Flu Test-	Return to school when free of fever for 24 hours & overall symptoms are improving. *If a fever develops or symptoms worsen, student should return home until symptoms
Severe Cough- where student gets red or blue in the face or makes high-pitched "croupy" or "whooping" sounds after coughing	have improved (at least 24 hours) Return to school when symptom free or physician's written approval to return to school.
Diarrhea- maximum of two watery stools in a	Return to school when free of diarrhea for 24
Vomiting	Return to school when free of upset stomach and/or vomiting for 24 hours
CONJUNCTIVITIS- inflammation of the conjunctiva of one or both eyes BACTERIAL (PINK EYE)- Swelling of the eyelids and a purulent discharge	Return to school 24 hours AFTER treatment has been started. Doctors note to be provided to nursing office.
Infected areas of the skin- with crust, yellow, dry area or rash, e.g. impetigo, ringworm, etc.	Return to school 24 hours AFTER treatment has been started.
Severe Itching of body or scalp- or constant scratching of scalp, e.g. head lice or scabies	Return to school after treatment, including free of lice or nits
Fainting or seizures- (other than pre-existing conditions) or general signs of listlessness, weakness, drowsiness, flushed face, headache or stiff neck	Return to school when symptom free or physician's written approval to return.
Streptococcal Infections-	Return to school 24 hours AFTER treatment as been initiated. Doctors note to be provided to nursing office.
Nurse Discretion- based on student's symptoms/presentation	To be determined by nurse based on symptoms.

BOE Goal 2: Improve teaching and learning through research-based strategies that support students' postsecondary success.

2.1 Increase Student Learning Opportunities

To highlight new areas of growth, we have implemented IPS (Individual Plans of Study) at the end of the school day this year, with grade levels rotating quarterly. Within this framework, each grade level focuses on one of the Kansas Career Clusters:

- **Kindergarten–Second Grade:** Developmental focus includes career recognition, number sense, safety, and natural forces.
- **Third Grade:** Developmental focus includes problem solving, fractions and decimals, coding, and types of energy.

2.4 Analyze and Improve Current Student Achievement Levels

OAC staff and students consistently set building WIGs, classroom WIGs, and individual student WIGs. This year, we are collaborating with the State Department and Mrs. Grienke on the PRISM model to learn how to effectively use KITE interims, with the goal of better preparing our students for state assessments.

2.5 Develop and Align an Effective Curriculum for All Core Subjects K-12

Current walkthrough data as of 12/2/2025 shows that fidelity to the core program or other SFT-approved resources is at 88% (84 of 96 observations). It is important to note that at the beginning of the year, teachers may focus on rules and procedures, which may not always align with approved instructional resources.
